However the results of the college are not upto our expectation especially in the commerce stream. We are analyzing the causes and taking corrective actions like remedial classes and intensive teaching during vacation for subjects like Economics and Accountancy where failure rate is higher. However there is qualitative improvement in the TYBCom result and Third year BA result is relatively better.
