INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

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4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Dr TK Tope College has adequate facilities for teaching learning in terms of classrooms, computerslaboratory, computing equipment like desktops, laptops, printers, photocopy machines, internet connections, wi-fi etc. Most classrooms are fitted with projectors and white boards. We have 13 classrooms and one computer laboratory for last year B.com students. Computers with internet access facilities are available for teaching staff, non-teaching staff and students.
